

Conference themes and objectives

In March 2003 the **EQOLISE** project took off in Rimini with the training session that graduated the first group of European IPS specialists. Twenty years later IPS is a cornerstone in European psychosocial care and the large European IPS community catches up again in Rimini to reflect upon the paths so far made and the road ahead. After Reykjavik 2021 and Berlin 2022, Rimini 2023 aims to strengthen the collaboration among European programs connected by the European IPS Learning Collaborative. On Day 19th the meeting will analyse the historical development of IPS in Europe, while on day 20th national experiences and new frontiers in IPS development will be addressed.

The meeting is promoted by the IPSILON association based in Bologna, by the Department of Education Science "G.M. Bertin" of Bologna University and by the Accredited training Institution EnAIP "C. Zavatta" of Rimini.

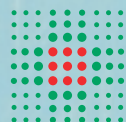
